Who Has the Wisdom?

The disciples are concerned with attaining power and status based on earthly standards, but Jesus teaches that God's ways are different, and helps us to learn and follow them.

What Do We See?

We stand still with Jesus as he listens to the voice of Bartimaeus who will not be silenced, hear Bartimaeus' response to Jesus' direct question, and reimagine the way we serve.

How Then Do We Love?

In Ruth's pledge to Naomi, a psalmist's recount of God's faithfulness, an image from the letter to the Hebrews of Christ's sacrifice, and Mark's recording of what is "first of all," we encounter love's summons to "give it all we've got."

How Then Shall We Give?

Widows – Naomi, Ruth, and one who gives all she has – challenge us to look into the deeper and sometimes subtle sources of oppression in our world.

What Lasts?

As Jesus warns of trouble ahead, we reflect on the climate crisis, unjust political systems, waning faith in global and national institutions, and look to what lasts.

Reign of Christ

We watch as Jesus speaks truth to power about ultimate power and feel moved to take our part in God's wise reign by living the truth of that witness, even when it threatens authority and puts us at risk.
