“Were you there when I laid the foundation of the Earth?” we hear God ask Job as we enter the Season of Creation.

“I was there,” we hear Wisdom declare on the fourth and last day of the season.

During the four weeks of the Season of Creation, we encounter divine wisdom in oceans, fauna and flora, storms, and the cosmos.
